A MESSAGE FROM Father Jesus

MY DEAR BROTHERS AND SISTERS,

A few weeks ago, the National Eucharistic Congress was celebrated in Indianapolis, with the intention to reflect more deeply on Jesus' real presence in the Most Holy Eucharist. Some people from our community took part in it, either as listeners or speakers. It was an amazing experience to be surrounded by tens of thousands of people in reverent adoration of Him who said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live forever...." (John 6:51).

There were moments of deep reflection, moments of pious adoration, and moments of meeting fellow Catholics from all over the nation and also moments of exploring the different galleries from various religious communities and editorial houses. But from all the different activities that took place, there was one in particular that touched me very deeply; it was the procession with the Blessed Sacrament through Indianapolis' downtown. Thousands and thousands of people gathered on the sidewalks and bridges, even through the windows of the tall buildings, it was possible to see people stopping everything that they were doing in order to follow the Eucharistic procession. All the priests marched ahead of the Blessed Sacrament, and as we were passing by, people with tears in their eyes were expressing in a loud voice their gratitude to us, priest, for our "yes" to the priestly vocation, since it is through our unworthy hands that the Holy Eucharist is a constant reality in the Church. Without priests, there is no Eucharist. The fervor of the people was very moving. Children, youth, and adults alike expressing their gratitude and admiration to all their priests. It reminded me of the words we heard in one of our recent Sunday Gospels, my heart, like the one of Jesus, "was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd." (Mc 6, 34). They were so needy of Jesus.

This experience during the Eucharistic procession reminded me that very moment in which God entrusted me His most sacred treasure: His children. Let me give you the context of it, when I was young, I always saw myself as a married man. My dream was to have at least two children, a girl and a boy. For this reason, the idea of becoming a priest was never even considered. In 2004, I was dating my girlfriend, and we were already planning to begin our life together by the end of that year, but God's plans were different. At the beginning of that year, my pastor invited me to a retreat for young men who were considering priesthood. For obvious reasons, I told him that it was not my case, but he insisted. Out of respect for him, I accepted the invitation. The rest is history. Here I am now, a priest of Jesus Christ. I spent fourteen years in the seminary, and during that time my desire to be a father was never lost. At times, it was even painful when playing with my little nephews. Once my brothers arrived, the kids left me immediately and ran to their father's arms saying "daddy, daddy," while my arms were left extended and empty. God knew of these feelings inside of me, and He did something about it. In 2014, I had the opportunity to take part in a mission trip to Burkina Faso, in Africa, through Catholic Relief Services (CRS). Our mission was to bring the Good News of the Gospel through the active presence of the Church, not only by preaching the Gospel, but by living and practicing it among them.

We visited many places, and among them was a orphanage. At our arrival, we were entrusted with a baby. We were six seminarians in the group. The baby that I received, "Angel" I named him, was one week old. He was found by the religious sisters on the street among the garbage. He was the most precious baby I have ever seen. My heart inside my chest was



beating so rapidly. I finally had a baby in my arms, one that I could consider mine because no one wanted him. My paternal instinct was completely activated, and ran all over me like an electric shock, energizing every cell in my body. I took the baby and immediately started rocking him in my arms. I was given a bottle with milk and I started feeding him. Little by little, he fell asleep while I rock him in my arms and hummed a lullaby in Spanish. I was the happiest man on Earth! Sadly, it didn't last long because our visit was short and I had to return the baby. My heart was broken.

On my way back to Chicago, I fell asleep on the plane, and in my dreams I heard God's voice: "You really want the baby, don't you?" – "yes," I reply. "I know of the fatherly love that exist within you, for that reason I have chosen you. You wanted to limit your fatherly love to only two children, but you are capable of more. Just like that baby that was rejected and abandoned, so are my children in the world. They have been rejected, abandoned, mistreated, and thrown to the garbage of sin. Just like that baby, they are in need of a fatherly love, someone who has that fire within him to listen, guide, and support them. I want you to show them my fatherly love and mercy. They are my children, and now I entrust them to you." I have been a priest for 6 years now, and I have tried my best to fulfill my duties, I am aware of my limitation, but at the end, I know it is God's work.

The Eucharistic Congress was a great reminder of the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, and that is something I firmly believe. But for me, it was also a revival of my call to the priesthood, by reminding me of the importance of my vocation for the people who God has entrusted to me to feed and care for, making sure that they all are lead back to the arms of the Heavenly Father by keeping them inside the flock guided by the Good Shepherd.

During the first Fridays of this month, August 2, 9, and 16, we will be having our Summer Speaker Series about the Holy Eucharist. It will be an opportunity to all of us to reflect more about such a magnificent mystery. Join us with an open heart and let God revive what need to be brought back to life within you!




