

A MESSAGE FROM Father Wince

DEAR PARISHIONERS,

"Where did summer go?" Each year, when the school year starts, when we turn the burgers on the grill on Labor Day weekend, and when Sunday afternoons begin to be filled with football games, it is not unusual for many of us to express a certain amount of amazement and regret that summer has slipped away. As we begin to anticipate the upcoming change of the seasons, I hope that all of us can look back over the last three months and notice that at least some enjoyable experiences came our way during this past summer.

As I read ahead in our weekend liturgical Readings, I noticed that on September 15th we will hear a very important Gospel passage. It appears in similar forms in all three of what are known as the "synoptic Gospels" (Matthew, Mark, and Luke). In all three it is situated close to the halfway point in each of the Gospels. This year we will hear St. Mark's version of the story. It centers around a conversation Jesus had with a handful of his followers, and then a larger group, in an area near Caesarea Philippi, a predominantly gentile region north of Galilee.

Up to this point Jesus' followers have heard his teachings, witnessed his mighty deeds, and have come to know him in a very special way. At this point I suspect Our Lord was wondering whether they really understood how his words, miracles, and presence provided clues to his true identity. So, Jesus asks the first group, the smaller one, two very pointed questions. The first is, "Who do people say that I am?" The second is, "But who you do say that I am?"

Whenever I imagine this story, I always presume that Jesus' disciples are quick to respond to the first question, reporting what they have heard from their respective local rumor mills. When Jesus poses the second question, I imagine that there was a pregnant pause in which they uncomfortably looked at their feet or perhaps even at each other's faces before Simon Peter stated, "You are the Christ."

I think each of us, at various times, have had our own personal Caesarea Philippi moments in which we have been asked to answer questions about who we think Jesus is and what he means to us. These questions and our answers to them often come a little differently depending on where we are on life's journey. For some of us, our response has been consistently the same as was Peter's. For others there have been times when we have been like the other followers of Jesus who



were not certain how to answer that second question, the more important one.

Our responses to the second question will certainly influence the way we live our lives, including our beliefs about the purpose of our lives, what God expects of us, and what – if anything- lies beyond the grave.

At the conclusion of this Gospel passage, Jesus speaks very clearly about what the role of Messiah will cost him – the cross. By implication it is the same price his followers -- both back then, throughout the ages, and even today -- need to be willing to pay to follow him. However, the cost of discipleship makes little sense unless we believe he truly is the Christ.

So, at this moment how would you answer the questions about who you think Jesus is and what does he means to you?

It is a very important question, perhaps the most important one we will ever answer. I believe its significance is the reason why the story containing it appears near the midway point in three of the four Gospels.

WELCOME to Sister Mayra

I am pleased to be able to address this community at Saint Mary of the Lake and Our Lady of Lourdes. My most sincere greetings to each one of you. I would also like to take this opportunity to introduce myself and put myself at your service. I am Sister Mayra Jiménez, a religious member of the "Family of Corde Jesu." Since God has called me to be part of this community of faith, I would like to tell you a little about myself.

I am originally from Tierranueva, a small town in the city of San Luis Potosí in Mexico. I am the third of four siblings who, along with my parents and my entire family, are a great support for me. During elementary school, I first encountered religious life in the classroom, with the sisters being my teachers. This allowed me to have a deeper experience of God, which would be a very important part of discovering my vocation.

Since I was young, I liked to participate in the activities of my parish that were appropriate to my age. When I turned 15, I decided to begin my formation to consecrate myself to God as a religious sister in my congregation, "Family of Corde Jesu," in response to God who calls me to serve Him, consecrating myself to God on August 15, 2009.

I thank God for these 15 years of religious life, during which He has allowed me to get to know places and people, as a catechist preparing children to receive their sacraments, as a primary school teacher, accompanying young people in High School and in the catechetical formation of adults. Aware that God, the Giver of all good, manifests Himself in the experiences and people that form our journey, I also thank each one of the people who have been part of my religious life in whom I have discovered how God makes himself present and shows us his love.

I would also like to thank all of you for the warm welcome full of love and faith with which I know you have welcomed my sisters of the congregation since their arrival in this community three years ago. I thank our Pastor Father Manuel Dorantes and all those who have made the presence of religious life in this community possible. May God reward you.

I place each one of you in the hands of God and of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our mother, and I entrust myself to your prayers, entrusting my service to God so that He may make of me an instrument of His within this community.






SECOND SATURDAY BIKE RIDES
