A MESSAGE FROM OUR Operations Director

"Never measure your generosity by what you give, but rather by what you have left." Bishop Fulton Sheen

Stewardship is a way of life. For Christians who follow in the way of Jesus, stewardship is an expression of discipleship. Historically, stewardship has been portrayed as giving of one's time, talent and treasure. However, I think stewardship is better defined as prayer, serving and sharing. When we recognize that God is the origin of all life, the giver of everything that we have and are, the source of our freedom and giftedness, a person responds by thanking God through prayer (time), by serving God and his people through ministry (talents), and by sharing our financial resources (treasure) with those in need. Stewardship is a way of life based upon conversion of the heart. Good stewards do four things:

- They receive God's gifts gratefully,
- They nurture God's gifts responsibly,
- They share God's gifts justly and charitably, and
- They return those gifts to God abundantly.

Gratitude is the cornerstone of stewardship. For those who see life with the eyes of faith, everything we receive is considered a gift. God gives us our existence and talents, our time and our treasure, our family and friends. These are all gifts. Stewards express their gratitude by a living a life filled with generosity.

Just as the parish expects you to be a good steward to the parish, parishioners should expect that the parish is a good steward of their gifts given to the parish, used wisely and prudently for the good of the community. What exactly does the parish do to be a good steward of your gifts? The parish ensures that all income received is properly safeguarded using financial best practices and deposited in interest-bearing accounts. Expenses are reviewed and managed to ensure the parish is receiving quality at a good price and all expenses support the mission of the parish. Utility and maintenance expenses are regulated with efficiency while also ensuring our buildings are properly kept.

Our Sunday collection and other donations do not fully cover our day-to-day operating expenses. The parish relies on interest and investment income as well as parish savings to cover the operating shortfall. This is not sustainable for the short- and long -term financial health of the parish. Our parishioners are extremely generous to the many ministries that we support such as the Soup Kitchen, migrant assistance, etc. These funds are restricted for those ministries. Our parish retains other funds such as the endowment account and the proceeds from the sale of Our Lady of Lourdes School. These funds are also restricted and cannot be used for parish operating expenses. This month, our parish annual report is being shared with you. In this report, you will find a detail of the parish finances comparing the past two fiscal years (July – June) including the operating budget for the current fiscal year. With the sad closure of Our Lady of Lourdes Church in May, this fiscal year's parish budget includes \$125,000 to cover property/casualty insurance, necessary utilities and general maintenance upkeep for the Our Lady of Lourdes property.

What can you do to help sustain the parish?

In the weeks ahead, our Pastor, Fr. Manny, will be asking for your additional support so the parish can continue its vital mission to the people of Uptown and Buena Park. The parish simply need



your financial support. You can help to sustain the parish by any of the following:

- Increase your weekly/monthly offertory donation to the parish. Any increase makes a difference!
- Make up for any missed donations to the parish.
- Enroll in online giving through Pushpay, our new e-giving provider or through Zelle to ensure that the parish receives your weekly/monthly gift even if you travel or miss a Sunday.
- Consider a qualified charitable distribution gift through your IRA.
- Leave a legacy or planned gift to the parish by remembering the parish in your will or as a beneficiary.

Should you ever have any questions about the above opportunities, please do not hesitate to reach out to me or Gabe Mayhugh during the week in the parish office.

What will your generosity to the parish be used for?

- Enhancing the faith life of our parish community and provide necessary tools to bring our community closer to Christ,
- Supporting our religious education and faith formation program in educating our children and adults in the faith,
- Addressing our parish infrastructure and capital needs for both short- and long-term needs.

Our parish administration and staff, parish pastoral and finance advisory councils and all those we serve daily offer our gratitude for your faithfulness, commitment and generosity to the parish. Our Catholic faith is important now more than ever especially as our society continues to rebel against our traditions and teachings. Please know that you are prayed for daily and that your prayers are requested for

the good of the parish. St. Mary of the Lake and Our Lady of Lourdes Parish is a beacon of hope in our community, both local and beyond. Thank you for your continued support of our mission.


Please note that any mass intentions received after the 15th OF THE MONTH will not be published in the bulletin, however it will still be prayed for at mass.

COMMEMORATION OF THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

The celebration of a day like today brings us to two thoughts: memory and hope.

Today is a day of remembrance of the past, a day to remember those who walked before us, those who have also accompanied us, who have given us life. To remember, to remember. Memory is what makes a people strong, because it feels rooted in a path, rooted in a history, rooted in a people. Memory makes us understand that we are not alone, we are a people: a people that has history, that has a past, that has life. Remembering so many who have shared a path with us, and are here [indicates the graves around]. It is not easy to remember. It is often difficult for us to think



back to what happened in my life, in my family, in my people... But today is a day of memory, the memory that takes us to the roots: to my roots, to the roots of my people.

Memory of those who have gone before us, who have lived their lives, who have ended this life; memory of so many people who do us good: in the family, among friends...

And then hope. Today is a memory to look forward, to look at our path, our way. We walk towards an encounter, with the Lord and with everyone. And we must ask the Lord for this grace of hope: the hope that never disappoints, never; hope, which is the everyday virtue that leads us forward, helps us solve problems and find ways out. But always forward, forward. This fruitful hope, this theological virtue of every day, of every moment: I will call it the theological virtue "of the kitchen", because it is at hand and always comes to our aid. The hope that does not disappoint: we live in this tension between memory and hope.

INTRODUCING PUSHPAY

We are in the process of rolling out our new electronic giving platform called Pushpay. This new platform will help to streamline the operations of our electronic giving. The software integrates fully with our database and church management system which will give our parish leadership more opportunity to engage with our parishioners on multiple levels. The ease at which someone can donate to the parish will be much enhanced and easy to do with most one-time donations taking less than a minute.

Those who give on a recurring basis will be able to select multiple options for recurring gifts and view their account at any time to know how they are contributing. Over the next few weeks, those who give to the parish through Give Central or Abundant will receive an email from us so that you can transition your giving to Pushpay.
