WELCOME TO Father Sergia

DEAR PARISHIONERS AND FRIENDS,

Gregorio and Clemente are my two nephews. Gregorio was adopted three years ago and Clemente just got home a month ago. All in the family were praying and waiting for almost two years for that call in which my brother and his wife are informed that they have become parents again.

A little more than a month ago, in the middle of a meeting, I received a text from my brother with a picture of a child with beautiful, big, dark eyes and a note that said: "meet Clemente." I cannot explain the physical, emotional, and spiritual experience in that moment; I became an uncle again. I can say I loved that child since the moment I saw him. The same happened with Gregorio. This experience has taught me that the human heart has the power to love even strangers, that we are born into families and that we can extend those family ties if we are willing to be vulnerable and willing to connect.

For the last weeks I have heard how Saint Mary of the Lake and Our Lady of Lourdes is a community where all are welcome and I am glad it is, but that beautiful statement can turn into a cliché if we are not willing to welcome the other as family and not just as passersby. I have met with people involved in the soup kitchen, the laundry ministry, and many of the Hispanic groups. Everyone I met has given me a reason to be grateful to be among you and I am looking forward to work shoulder to shoulder with all of you.

Being a priest, I know Gregorio and Clement are not just my nephews, but they are the beneficiaries of my 401k and the inheritors of my little savings. They are family and if they need help, I will have to be there for them no matter what. I have a moral, emotional, and financial responsibility with them. I welcomed them into my life fully aware that I must invest in them.



Volunteers are NEEDED to make Sack Meals and to help with service on Wednesday nights. <u>To make this a success</u> <u>consistently each week, we need 200 individuals/</u> <u>families to commit to donating at least once a month.</u>

We are looking to have <u>50 volunteer make 5 Sack Meals</u> <u>each week</u>.

Each sack meal should contain:

- 2 lunchmeat sandwiches with no condiments, cheese is optional but a nice addition
- 2 cheese sticks
- 1 bag of chips (or similar)
- 1 piece of soft fruit (for example, orange, banana, grapes) Dessert (cookies or candy bar)
- Beverage (juice box, can of soda, or 8oz water bottle/ sports drink)
- Napkin

Please pack each meal in a gallon-sized plastic bag (like Ziploc). Or please use a plastic grocery bag.

GIVING WITH THE HEAD AND THE HEART

As we approach the end of the calendar/tax year, it is a time when many think about their year-end charitable giving. Here are a few ways to maximize your charitable donations while minimizing your tax liability and saving yourself time and money in the process.

Donor Advised Fund (DAF): A DAF is a type of charitable giving account: you make a donation to your DAF account, receive a tax deduction for the current tax year, and have the flexibility to direct your DAF balance as gifts to the parish at any time in the future. It's simple, flexible and tax efficient.

Stocks and Mutual Funds: Giving stocks, bonds, mutual funds or ETFs to the parish rather than cash could increase the value of your gifts, cost you less money, and lower your tax bill. Donating publicly traded securities allows you to avoid capital gains taxes (which can be as high as 20% on long-term holdings) and you are still able to claim a charitable deduction for the full fair-market value of the donated securities. That stretches your dollar further than just selling the stock and giving cash.

Gifts from Your Individual Retirement Account (IRA): Are you taking Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from an IRA? You can avoid income taxes on your RMD by making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA and avoid paying taxes on the distribution. That's a huge tax advantage that satisfies part or all of your required minimum distribution. Thank you for considering St. Mary of the Lake-Our Lady of Lourdes Parish in your charitable giving plans.

Remember to leave the parish in your estate plans: The parish sometimes learns that former or current parishioners, who recently passed away, left the parish in their will or named the parish as a beneficiary of some of their remaining assets. This is a remarkable way to memorialize your own legacy. With such gifts, the parish invests and uses these funds for long-term planning and investment of the parish or as the donor intends.

Recent Capital Projects

The parish recently completed several necessary capital repairs throughout the campus. Below is a list of projects completed along with some before, in-process and after pictures to show the great work happening on our campus buildings.

- The rectory porch clay tile roof was damaged from ice and snow last year and caused the wood truces underneath to rot. This was covered by an insurance claim.
- The Parish Office received necessary tuckpointing and gutter work after a freeze/thaw event last winter. Some of the repairs were covered by an insurance claim. The problem extended to the poor roof quality and much-needed parapet wall tuck pointing. These projects were covered by the endowment fund.
- The courtyard wall in between the church and the parish office was safety hazard. Many of the limestone pieces were worn away and loose due to missing mortar. The wall was completely rebuilt thanks to your generosity.
- The school stairs were a tripping and safety hazard. The top stair was also not in compliance with current code, so the entire set of stairs were replaced with a new longer top landing outside the exit doors. Thank you for your generosity to the parish so that these necessary projects can take place.
